How to Apply for an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card



Who can get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card?

Children and adults who live in Arizona can get an ID card.

It is a good idea to have an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card if you don't have an Arizona driver's license.

- Having an Arizona ID card can make it easier for you to travel, sign up for school or other activities.
- An Arizona ID card has your address on it.
- An Arizona ID card with a photo lets the police share your information and picture faster in an emergency.
- An Arizona ID card can help stop others from stealing your personal information.

What does an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card cost?

People aged 65 or older can get an ID card for free. People receiving Federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) disability checks may also qualify for a free card.

Identification (ID) Card

- Ages 0-64: \$12
- Age 65 and older: no fee
- Recipients of Supplemental Security Income: no fee

Where can you get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card?

Arizona ID cards for children and adults are available at any Motor Vehicle Division Office or Authorized Third Party Driver License provider. Visit <https://azdot.gov/mvd/mvd-hours-and-locations> or <https://azdot.gov/mvd/services/driver-services/authorized-third-party-driver-license-locations> to find a location near you.

What Records do I need to have to get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card?

Types of records are listed below with examples.

- Bring One Document: Proof of Identity or who you are (Birth certificate; U.S. Passport; Passport Card). Visit <https://www.vitalchek.com/v/vital-records/arizona> to apply if you need a certified copy of an Arizona birth certificate.
- Social Security Number (you will need your complete Social Security number)
- Visit <https://www.ssa.gov/myaccount/> and set up an account to order a replacement Social Security card.
- Bring Two Documents that show you live in Arizona. For example, you can bring utility bills, credit card/bank statements, or an insurance policy. You must complete an Arizona Residency Affidavit if you do not have documents that prove you live in Arizona. It can be found at <https://apps.azdot.gov/files/mvd/mvd-forms-lib/40-5143.pdf>.
- You must show legal proof of name change if your current legal name is different from the one shown on a document. For example, you can bring a marriage certificate, divorce decree, adoption papers, or court order.



Can I get help to get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card?

Voteriders offers help at no cost to get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card. Visit Voteriders.org Arizona at <https://www.voteriders.org/states/arizona/> for help. They will help get records needed to get an ID card for anyone who needs a card.

Can I get an Arizona State Identification (ID) Card online?

Yes, go to the ADOT MVD website, <https://azdot.gov/mvd>. Click on “Driver License Information” under the Driver Services heading. Click on the link to complete the driver license/identification card application online.

Arizona Travel ID

Starting May 7, 2025, if you plan to travel by airplane, you can only use:

- An Arizona Travel ID
- A U.S. passport and
- Other federally approved identification

A Travel ID costs \$25.
