# Policy and Procedure for SFY-2012

Policy and Procedure ALERTS are intended to notify Community Action Program (CAP) Agencies about newly developed, updated or revised Division of Aging and Adult Services Policies and Procedures. Please ensure that all appropriate CAP staff is provided with this information.

## **Monthly Case Management Report Change**

The following is being provided to formalize instructions previously provided to all agencies receiving Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) funds relating to the federal requirement to capture additional programmatic information. The revised Monthly Case Management Report includes one (1) additional mandatory federal reporting criterion. This new form must be used when submitting your agency monthly reports. See attached report and instruction for completion of the form. Please note: The yellow highlighted fields require no data entry as they are formulated to be auto-summed.

The additional section is *C.2.-Unduplicated count for each of the vulnerable group* which asks that data be reported separately for each of the three vulnerable groups of households for each type of LIHEAP. For example, if a household received only one (1) point for a "person 60 years or older", this household is counted once in that category. If a household received three (3) points [one (1) point each for "person 60 years or older", "disabled", and "age 5 years or younger"], this household is counted in each of the vulnerable categories.

An area of inaccurate reporting on the Monthly Case Management Report has been identified as Section *E-LIHEAP Applicant Households – All categories, regardless of whether assisted.* Section E requires the reporting agency to provide information on all applications. This includes households that have applications pending, households whose application has been denied or households that have been turned away, etc. Please see the highlighted section E on the attached instructions sheet.

The state is required to report this information for Federal Fiscal Year 2012 which covers the period of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012. As previously instructed, agencies receiving LIHEAP funds are required to provide data on these new elements on the Monthly Case Management Report beginning October 2011. Please amend Monthly Case Management Reports that have been submitted for October 2011 forward that did not utilize the new format. Amended reports are to be submitted to your respective Contract Specialist. Please note: With the exception of yellow highlighted fields, all other data fields are required to be completed.

#### CASE MANAGEMENT REPORT INSTRUCTIONS

#### A. HOUSEHOLD VOUCHERS

- 1. STCS HH # and STCS \$\(\frac{1}{2}\) Enter the number of households that received STCS services during the report month. Enter the total dollar amount expended on the same households for the report month reporting. Data should be provided according to the categories: a) utility assistance, b) mortgage, rent or motel, and c) special needs.
- 2. <u>LIHEAP HH # and LIHEAP \$ Enter the number of households that received regular utility assistance during the report month. Enter the total dollar amount expended on the same households for the report month. Include regular utility payments and deposits.</u>
- 3. <u>LIHEAP Supplemental HH # and LIHEAP Supplemental \$</u> Enter the number of households that received Supplemental Utility Assistance for the report month. Also enter the dollar amount expended on these households. The households and funds reported here should not be included under #2 "LIHEAP HH # and LIHEAP \$".
- 4. <u>LIHEAP Assurance 16 HH# and LIHEAP Assurance 16\$</u> Enter the number of households that received utility assistance and energy conservation education under the Assurance 16 program component. Include both deposits and utility payments. Also enter the dollar amount expended on these households. The households and funds reported here should also be reported under "LIHEAP # "and "LIHEAP Supplemental" and "LIHEAP Supplemental" and "LIHEAP Supplemental".
- 5. Other HH # and Other \$ Enter the number and dollar amount of households that received assistance for the report month for utilities, mortgage/rent/motel, or special needs from other sources such as CSBG, ESG, local funds, Energy Assistance Funds or non-DAAS funds as listed on the itemized service budget.
- 6. Neighbors Helping Neighbors (NHN) Enter the number of households that received a utility assistance payment funded with the NHN funds during the report month. This number should NOT be included in either Regular or Supplemental LIHEAP. Enter the dollar amount expended for the report month.
- 7. LIHEAP Total HH # NO DATA ENTRY NECESSARY; THIS IS AN AUTO-SUM CATEGORY.

#### B. LIHEAP ASSISTED HOUSEHOLDS ONLY

- 1. Under "Number of Assisted Households", (Regular LIHEAP Category and/or the Supplemental LIHEAP category). NO DATA ENTRY REQUIRED; THE CELLS WILL AUTO-POPULATE BASED UPON DATA ENTERED IN A.2 AND A.3 FOR THE REPORT MONTH.
- 2. Enter the number of households that received Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income was under 0% to 25% of SMI
- 3. Enter the number of households that received Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income was between 26% to 50% of SMI.
- 4. Enter the number of households that received Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income was between 51% to 75% of SMI.
- 5. Enter the number of households that received Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income was between 76% and 100% Si, Poverty.
- 6. NO DATA ENTRY NECESSARY; THIS IS AN AUTO-SUM CATEGORY.

#### C.1. Vulnerable Categories

- 1. Enter the number of households that contained a member Age 60 or older in the Regular LIHEAP Category or the Supplemental LIHEAP category; this data can be duplicated (For example a household may receive points; once under Disabled once under Elderly and once under Age 5 or younger).
- 2. Enter the number of households which contained a Disabled Household Member in the Regular LİHEAP Category or the Supplemental LIHEAP category; this data can be duplicated (For example a household may receive points: once under Disabled once under Elderly and once under Age 5 or younger).
- 3. Enter the number of households which contained a Household Member Age 5 or Younger in the Regular LIHEAP Category or the Supplemental LIHEAP category; this data can be duplicated (For example a household may receive points: once under Disabled once under Elderly and once under Age 5 or younger).
- 4. Number of households by Any Vulnerable Group for EACH Type of Assistance (9)L UNDUPLICATED Élderly/Disabled/Young Child For each type of LIHEAP assistance provided, include the unduplicated number of households that had at least one member belonging to any of the three vulnerable household groups. For example, if a Utility Assistance benefit assisted a household that includes any vulnerable members, then count that household once under any vulnerable group (Elderly, Disabled, or Young Child) for regular LIHEAP. THIS DATA MUST BE UNDUPLICATED ACROSS THE VULNERABLE CATEGORIES. (Another example: If a Household contained one member who was disabled and one member who was Age 5 or Younger, this household would be counted only ONCE).

#### C.2. Unduplicated number of Households by Each Vulnerable Group for EACH Type of Assistance

Data needs to be reported separately for each of the three vulnerable groups of households for EACH type of LIHEAP. In calculating and reporting the data, note the following:

- 1. A household is to be counted for each vulnerable group in which the household has at least one member who is 60 years or older, disabled, or age 5 years or under. For example, a household that includes one child 2 years old, another child 4 years old, and an elderly member who is also disabled and receives a regular LIHEAP benefit, the household members would be counted once under each of the vulnerable groups: 60 years or older; disabled; and age 5 or under.
- 2. An assisted household with two or more members in the same vulnerable group is to be counted once. For example, a household with two members who are 65 years old would be counted once under "60 years or older."
- 3. The data on vulnerable groups are household counts; not the count of vulnerable persons or the number of heads of households that are vulnerable.

#### D.1. UNDUPLICATED NUMBER OF HOUSEHOLDS SERVED BY ANY TYPE OF LIHEAP ASSISTANCE

Enter the total number of Households that received LIHEAP Assistance. <u>THIS DATA MUST BE UNDUPLICATED</u>. Count a household once that received at least one type of LIHEAP assistance regardless of the type(s) of assistance provided. For example, if a household received a regular LIHEAP assistance benefit and a LIHEAP Supplemental assistance benefit, then count that household <u>once</u> under ANY Type of LIHEAP assistance, regardless of receiving two types of LIHEAP assistance.

#### E. LIHEAP APPLICANT HOUSEHOLDS - ALL CATEGORIES REGARDLESS OF WHETHER ASSISTED

- 1. Enter the number of households that <a href="mailto:applied">applied</a> for <a href="mailto:Regular LIHEAP Assistance">Regular LIHEAP Assistance</a> and/or <a href="mailto:Supplemental LIHEAP">Supplemental LIHEAP</a> whether or not assisted for the report month. (This should include households that were denied, turned away, etc.)
- 2. Enter the number of households that applied for Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income is 0% to 25% of SMI.
- 3. Enter the number of households that applied for Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income is 26% to 50% of SMI.
- 4. Enter the number of households that applied for Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income is 51% to 75% of SMI.
- 5. Enter the number of households that applied for Regular LIHEAP Assistance and/or Supplemental LIHEAP whose income was between 76% to 100%.
- 6. NO DATA ENTRY NECESSARY; THIS IS AN AUTO-SUM CATEGORY
- F. TOTAL CASE MANAGEMENT HOUSEHOLDS SERVED Enter number of total case managed households served during the report month. Data reported in this section may be duplicated under sections 1, 2, and 3. A case managed household is one that completes an initial assessment (face-to-face or via telephone) with a case manager or other qualified agency staff person, regardless of whether or not financial assistance is authorized.
